## Myth?



Every course that I take must be directly related to my degree (or major).


As a newcomer, I expect that the people in my classes will probably know each other already.

- Classroom Participation
  - Asking Questions
  - Discussion with peers and instructor
- Group Work

# Expectations in a Canadian Classroom



- Assessment
  - Essays, quizzes, presentations, group projects, midterm tests, final exam
  - Manage your time to complete and hand in work and prepare for tests
- Critical thinking
  - Analyze, synthesize, apply preferred over simple memorization





Professors won't help you and you should not contact them outside of class time.

## Expectations in a Canadian Classroom



- Classroom Etiquette
  - Equality, reciprocal respect
  - "On time for class" means 5 minutes early!
  - Do no want to be repeatedly late
  - Professors will have office hours for you to go to ask your specific questions. Use them





One failing grade and this is the end of my studies at UVic!






If I need to ask for help, it means I am failing.
