

Study Permit

- Status document: allows you to stay in Canada and engage in a program of study
- Required for programs longer than 6 months
- You must apply to extend your study permit before it expires
- You can apply to change, replace or extend your study permit from within Canada
- Apply for a new study permit to <u>change schools</u>
- If you are outside Canada when your study permit expires you must apply for a new one



Study Permit Conditions

As a study permit holder, you must:

- be enrolled at a <u>designated learning institution (DLI)</u>, unless you're exempt
- show you're actively pursuing your studies, unless you're exempt, by
 - being enrolled full-time or part-time during each academic semester (excluding regularly scheduled breaks)
 - making progress towards completing your program's courses and
 - not taking <u>authorized leaves longer than 150 days</u> from your study program
- apply for a new study permit to <u>change schools</u>
- end your studies if you no longer meet the requirements of being a student and
- leave Canada when your permit expires

IRCC - <u>Study Permit Conditions</u>

Temporary Resident Visa (TRV)

- Only required for certain nationalities
- Entry document: allows entry to Canada
- You may continue your studies if it expires
- You can apply for a new TRV inside Canada
- You can apply for a new TRV outside
 Canada



Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA)

- Only required for certain nationalities
- Entry document: allows entry to Canada
- Only required for entry to Canada by air
- You may continue your studies if it expires
- You can apply for an eTA online
- If you change your passport, you will need to get a new eTA

Immigration Documents for Family Members

Spouse/common law partner

- Spousal Open Work Permit (SOWP) or Visitor Visa
 - SOWP only available to spouses/partners of students in select programs such as master's, PhD and certain professional degree programs at the undergrad level.
- eTA or TRV

- Dependent children
- Study permit or Visitor Visa
- eTA or TRV
