Definition of family members

As per IRCC's <u>Glossary</u>, family members refer to an applicant's closest relatives, in the context of an application to IRCC. It is defined as a spouse or common-law partner, dependent children, and their dependent children.




Immigration documents for accompanying family members

Spouse/common-law partner

- eTA or TRV
- <u>Spousal Open Work Permit (SOWP)</u> (if meeting the eligibility requirements)

Dependent children

- eTA or TRV
- Study permit
 - If your dependent children are at school age, you should apply for a study permit for them with your study permit



Definition of accompanying family: <u>IRCC website</u>

Spousal open work permit eligibility

- Starting January 21, 2025, your spouse or commonlaw partner may be eligible for an <u>open work</u> <u>permit</u> if you have a valid study permit for a PGWP eligible program **and** you're either
 - studying in a master's degree program of 16 months or longer
 - studying in a **doctoral degree** program
 - participating in an <u>eligible program</u>, or
 - studying in select <u>professional and eligible</u> <u>programs</u> as identified by IRCC



Maintaining your documents

- Permits can not be issued beyond your passport validity
- Always keep your and your accompanying family member's documents valid
- Extend your permits 6-8 months prior to their expiry
- If you apply to extend your permits before they expire, you will have <u>maintained status</u> while waiting for the new permits





On-campus housing

What is UVic Family Housing?

- Family housing is available for families with or without children.
- Units are rented to <u>eligible UVic students</u> on a yearly basis, up to a maximum stay of six years
- Apartments and townhouses between 1- to 4-bedroom units

When to apply?

- Apply as soon as you have your NetLink ID
- Long waitlist, spaces are not guaranteed



Off-campus housing

Where do I find information on off-campus housing?

• ICS Off-Campus Housing resource page is a great place to start

Things to consider when searching:

- No ideal place, it all depends on your family needs:
 - e.g. building type, neighbours and neighbourhood, nearby amenities, etc
- Some landlords will limit the number of people living in the rental unit
- A landlord cannot refuse to rent to you because you have children
- Families are protected against discrimination <u>Residential</u> <u>Tenancy Branch (RTB)</u>





BC school system

Public schools:

Your minor children may be eligible for free public school if:

- Your study or work permit is valid for at least one year
- You are enrolled at UVic

Private and independent schools:

- Charge tuition fees
- Specialized program available, e.g. International Baccalaureate (IB)



Grades

- A child must be 5 years old by December 31 of the school year
- Grade placements are determined by the child's birth year

School districts

- Identify your <u>school district</u> before enrolling your child
- Determined by the municipality of your residential address in BC
- Most students living on or near campus will be in <u>Greater Victoria School District SD 61</u>
- Other districts:
 - Sooke School District SD 62
 - Saanich School District SD 63



Catchments

Catchment model:

Your children will be assigned a school based on your address at time of registration.

Check your catchment school:

- Greater Victoria School District SD 61
- Sooke School District SD 62
- Saanich School District SD 63



School registration

- To register: have a permanent address in Victoria and your child(ren) are in BC
- Reach out to your school district's international education office:
 - SD 61 Victoria International Education
 - SD 62 Sooke Schools International Student Program
 - SD 63 Saanich International Student Program
- They will provide you with application information, review your documentation, and support you in registering your child for school



Preparing your documents

Get ready by making copies of:

- Your family's identification documents (passport, birth certificate)
- Proof of residence (tenancy agreement or utility bill)
- Your study or work permit
- Immunization records
- School report cards, grades, from the past two years



Before school age daycare

Child Care Services on Campus:

- For children of full-time students
- Infant to 5 YO
- Apply ASAP
- Expect a <u>wait list</u> for younger than 3 YO
- Fees: \$10/per day (subsidized by BC)


Finding daycare:

Comprehensive health insurance




Health insurance overview for dependents

Waiting for BC MSP Rest of time in BC BC Medical Services Plan (MSP) Primary care Basic medical and emergency coverage GuardMe@UVic /Mandatory (mandatory) for people living in BC for more than 6 Temporary Medical Insurance months Basic medical and emergency CAD\$ 75/month (intl students) coverage during <u>first term</u> at UVic Free for non students UVSS AND GSS EXTENDED HEALTH AND DENTAL BENEFIT PLANS Extended care Dental, vision, and additional coverage to members of UVic undergraduate and graduate student societies via Studentcare

GuardMe

- Primary health insurance for dependents (children or spouse) until BC MSP coverage begins
- Medical care for emergencies and illnesses
- Can purchase whenever dependents will arrive
- Purchase online at guard.me/uvic
 - With GuardMe Coverage (Student still has GuardMe plan)
 - With BC MSP coverage (Student has active BC MSP)



BC Medical Services Plan (BC MSP)

- Mandatory for any person who will reside in BC for 6 months or more
- Apply for BC MSP at the same time or <u>update</u> your account when your family members arrive
- 3-month eligibility waiting period once family members arrive in BC
- Expiry of BC MSP is based on status documents expiration date.
- \$75 International Student Health Fee: only for family members who are Study Permit holders



Extended Health and Dental

- Provided via the GSS/UVSS
- Students may enroll dependents (spouse or children)
- Dependent opt-ins must be renewed annually
- Opt in online via Alumo
- Deadline:
 - Change-of-coverage period:

Fall term: August 22 to September 22

Spring Term: December 22 – Jan 22

Summer session: April 22 – May 22
