Unless otherwise specified, the courses listed for each UVic department are the only courses within that department that you are eligible to register for.


Some departments direct you to the **UVic Course Calendar Catalogue** to see their course options, in which case you may select any course from that department.

### **Definitions**

- A prerequisite is a course or requirement that must be completed before you can take a particular course.
- A corequisite is a course or other requirement that must be completed before or at the same time as a particular course.
- A year 'standing' restriction limits enrollment to students at a certain year level

### **Registering for Courses**

Every student receives a registration email with your "time ticket", indicating when you can start registering for courses. You can register any time after the date and time stated in your time ticket, but don't wait too long! Classes fill up quickly.
