



Victoria - what to expect

Geography


- Small island on West Coast of Canada
- Beaches, mountains, and forests
- ~400,000 people in Greater Victoria

Climate

- Mild weather year-round
- Dry summers, rainy winters
- Snow is very rare

UVic

- Located 20 mins from Downtown Victoria
- Spacious, green campus
- ~20,000 students





Packing

What to pack:

- Medications: <u>3-month supply</u>
- Weather appropriate clothes
- Specialty toiletries
- Reminder of home

What NOT to pack:

- Large amounts of cash
- Parkas, snow boots
- Agricultural food items
 (tip: <u>check CBSA guidelines</u>)
- General housewares





Important documents

In addition to your immigration docs, bring:

- Prescriptions
- Payment methods
- Identity documents
- Driver's license
- Medical and vaccination records

Important: translating all medical documents in your home country will save you money and time

Travel Documentation checklist:

- ☐ Valid passport or other acceptable travel document
- □ Valid study permit or letter of introduction
- ☐ Valid temporary resident visa OR eTA (unless exempt)
- Verification of enrolment (Online Tools)
- Proof of funds
- □ Valid letter of acceptance or <u>study permit information</u> <u>letter</u> from UVic
- □ Proof of a valid <u>immigration medical examination</u> (if required)
- ☐ Advance Declaration confirmation email (Optional)

Note: As an international student in Canada, it is your responsibility to ensure that you continue to meet the conditions of your study permit, including the requirement to actively pursue studies. Your study permit will automatically become invalid 90 days after you complete your study program, regardless of the expiry date



Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA)




Temporary Resident Visa (TRV)



- Answer questions honestly and be ready to explain your purpose of visit and provide information as required
- Review your physical immigration documents carefully before you leave





Arriving in Victoria

Most students will arrive to Victoria by:

- Plane (Victoria International Airport, YYJ)
- <u>Ferry</u> (Vancouver Tsawwassen Terminal to Victoria - Swartz Bay Terminal)

Services at the Victoria airport:

- Currency exchange
- Wifi
- Information

Transit options to where you are staying:

- BC Transit Bus (\$6 for day pass, cash only)
- BC Connector (YVR to YYJ)
- Uber, Lyft
- Taxi (~\$75)


