- Snow is very rare •



- Galloping Goose Regional Trail


Buses

- Check your email for more details


Early move-in:



Living Costs & Regular Expenses

Costs and expenses vary based on:

- Housing: living in Residence, sharing house/apartment, or renting a unit
- Lifestyle: eating out *vs* cooking at home
- **Transportation**: bus, bike or car?
- Sports and leisure: gear, a gym membership, entrance passes to events, museums, cinema, books
- Shopping: how much you spend on clothing, shoes and other items?

<u>Numbeo</u> is a useful tool for calculating living costs!







Bank Account

Opening a bank account

<u>Study permit</u> holder \rightarrow open a bank account in Canada

Major banks in Victoria include: <u>BMO, CIBC, RBC, Scotiabank, TD Canada Trust</u>

Documents needed:

- Passport
- Study permit
- Letter of enrolment from UVic

Apply for a credit card

- Helps you build a credit score in Canada
- Make bill payments
- Learn more about Credit Cards





Managing Your Finances

If you need to **transfer money** from your home country:

- Consult your bank on how an international wire process works •
- Transactions may take multiple days •
- Be aware of deadline for tuition and other payments ullet
- Ask about admin/transaction fees


UVic tuition can be paid by:

- Canadian debit or online billing ullet
- Cheque, money order, or bank draft
- Wire transfer ullet
- Convera Global pay ullet





Documentation and Translation



Important documents you may need: Identification (passport)


- Driver's license
- References from previous employers or landlords
- Prescriptions for ongoing medication lacksquare

Health Insurance - MTMI

New international students are automatically enrolled in the Mandatory Temporary Medical Insurance (MTMI)

Coverage: Sep 1-Dec 31, 2025 Grace period: Aug 18 – Aug 31

Health Insurance – BC MSP

Enrolment in British Columbia's Medical Service Plan (BC MSP) is mandatory for any person who will reside in BC for 6 months or longer.

Apply online for BC MSP as soon as you arrive in BC. Waiting period for coverage eligibility is 3 months from arrival month.

International Student Health Fee: CAD \$75/month (per person) payable to BC government's Revenue Services.


