I really liked how he was always willing to answer questions and could admit that he didn't know everything so was willing to ask Instructor Name or look up the answer so we could know

Instructor Name was absolutely phenomenal! He was always really approachable, really knowledgeable in what he was teaching, and always was available to lend us a hand in what we were learning. As well, he was always really cheery and enthusiastic, and really inspired us all to be more immersed in the material. Such Great! Such wow! 10 out of 10 for sure.

Instructor Name was very enthusiastic and maintained a lively class environment. He explained concepts clearly and was generally easy and fun to learn from.

Very knowledgeable with explanations and responses to questions - almost always had a very detailed explanation for questions asked in class and always made things much clearer. I loved the enthusiasm towards this area and how it was brought to the class and made me more excited about the material.

Instructor Name was very approachable in class, and I understand that he is busy with his own research projects, but to not have access to either instructor for 3-5 days over a weekend when we have an assignment worth 10% of our grade due AND a poster due the same day worth 25+% of our grade was not acceptable.

Instructor Name was always willing to answer questions even when he was super busy. His explanations of concepts were fantastic and simplified so that it was easy to understand. I really enjoyed his teaching

### Comment

Oh boy! I am never sure for this section about what to say. I think maybe the course felt a little slow in the beginning, and then I felt pretty rushed at the end. I'm not really sure how that could be avoided though, based on the nature of our project. Oh well, maybe we need to be thoroughly warned to not procrastinate!?! Do it! Be mean! Other than that, it was an awesome class and lab setup, and I really enjoyed being able to work with our own data all the way through the course.

Some of the problem sets involved intense mathematical drudgery that didn't really seem to help me learn the concepts in question.

Some guidelines - especially in regards to the poster format - where somewhat unclear. It would have been very useful to have a much more defined structure for the posters (font size, amount of text to figures, etc.).

This course was run like a graduate level seminar. While I can appreciate exposing undergrad students to this style of teaching, with the condensed course style, it was not effective. We weren't taught, more that we were expected to read a lot independently, understand the material, and then not apply the material to any examples. There was not an effective way to take notes for this class - casual introduction to the next day's topic was loose and not informative. The assignments were not corrected in a way that helped me understand what I did wrong, and solutions were not posted. I learned how to throw things at a piece of paper and hope they stick with this course.

The only thing that I didn't like was when Instructor Name went away for a few days and left Instructor Name to teach and answer all of our questions and then Instructor Name was super busy and didn't really have time to help us, but did anyways. Especially right around the time that the big project was due.
