

Make an Appointment - Research Help -


Book an appointment to get help from a librarian in person, via Zoom, or by phone. Choose from a 15, 30, or 45 minute appointment, dept (15 is ideal for a citation question, for example).

Librarians can help you to develop your research topic, craft your search strategy, manage your data, understand how to cite your sources


- Just need help fast? Book the next available librarian.


- •Search at the <u>Library website (www.uvic.ca/library)</u>




<u>Digital Scholarship Commons</u> (3rd floor - main library)

- Guidance on research <u>data management plans</u> (for students doing research)


