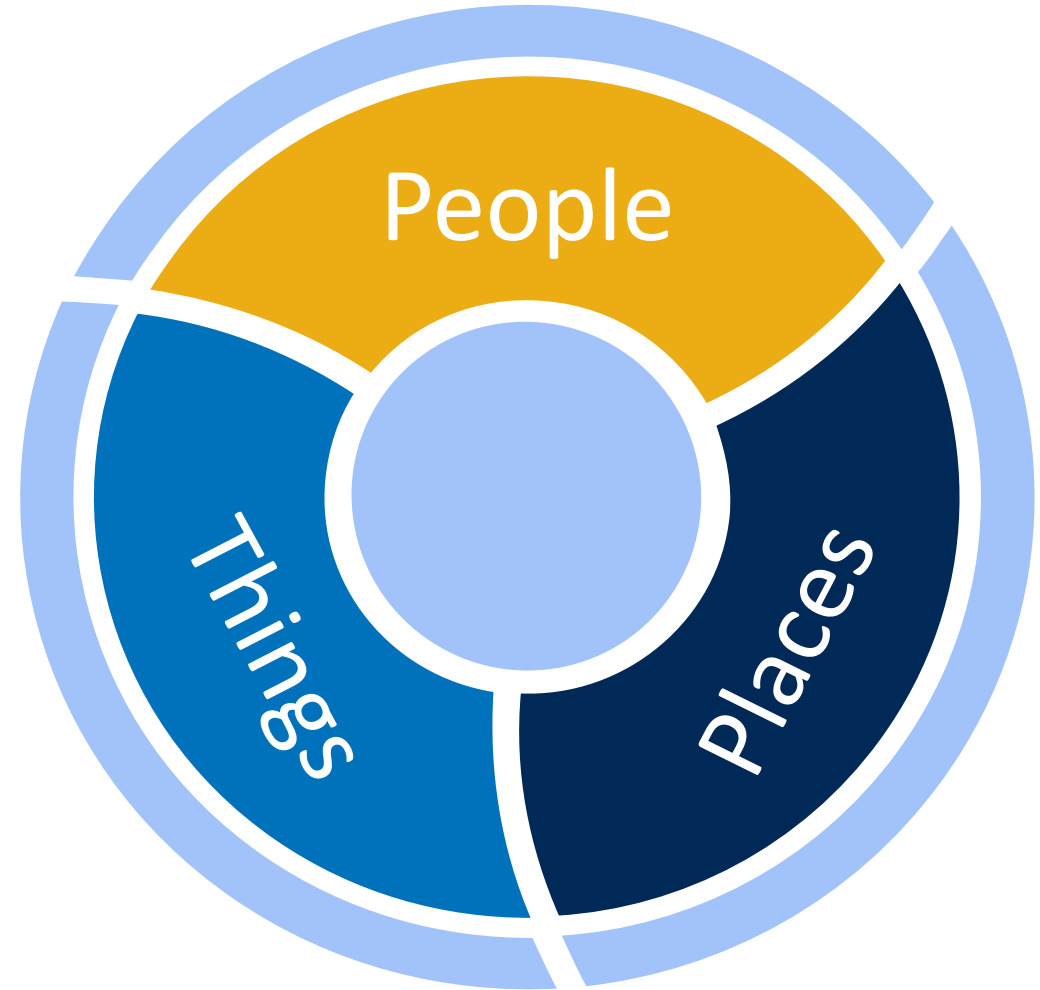

- All librarians are information experts and can answer general research questions
- Subject librarians have in-depth knowledge related to their fields, and can assist students with more complex or deeper research questions

Book an appointment with a librarian

Make an Appointment - Research Help

Book an appointment to get help from a librarian in person, via Zoom, or by phone. Choose from a 15, 30, or 45 minute appointment, depending on your needs (15 is ideal for a citation question, for example).

Librarians can help you to develop your research topic, craft your search strategy, manage your data, understand how to cite your sources, and more.

- Just need help fast? Book the next available librarian.
- Looking for in-depth help on a particular subject? Book an appointment with a subject liaison librarian or browse our [list of specialist librarians](#).

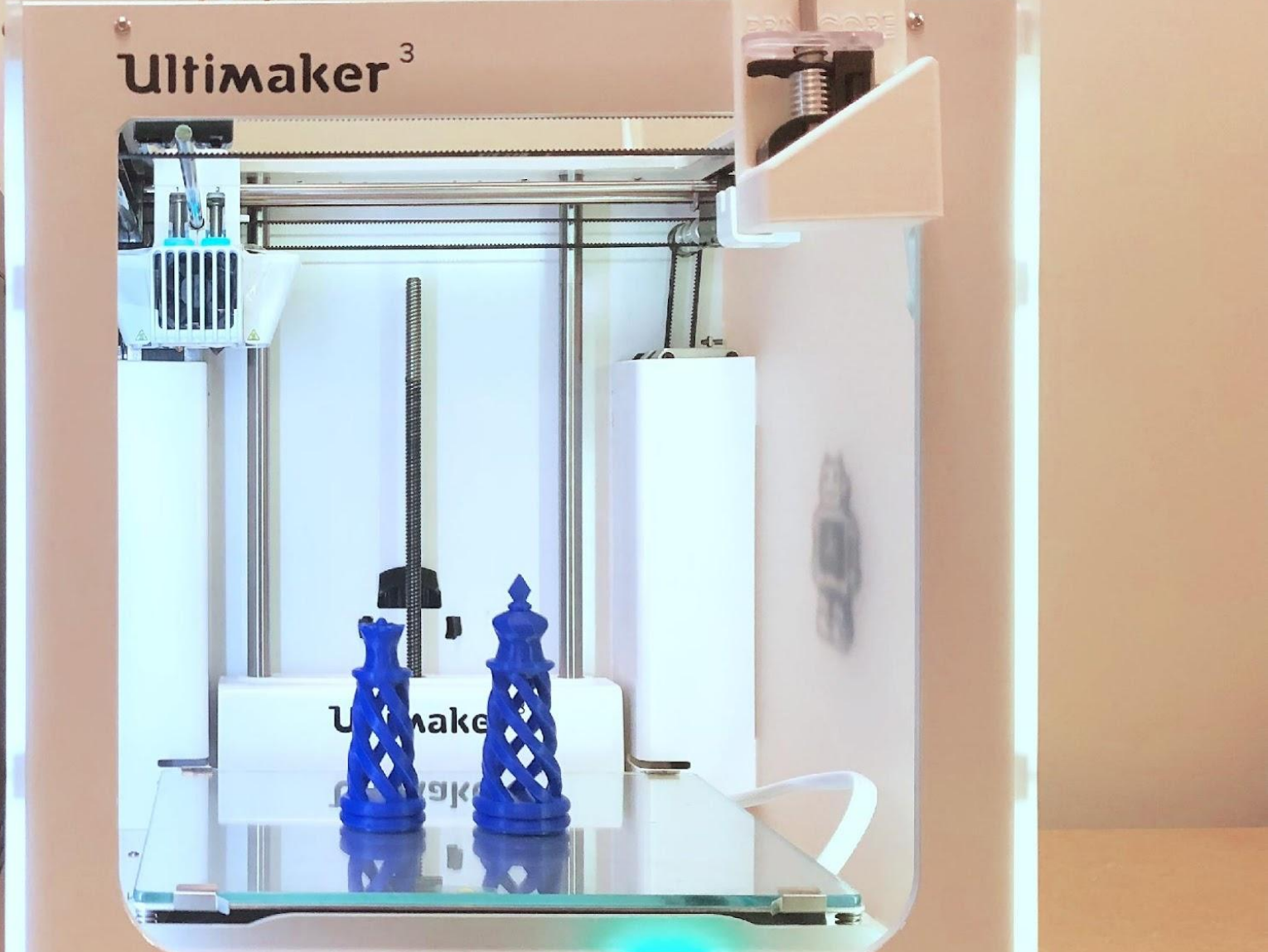
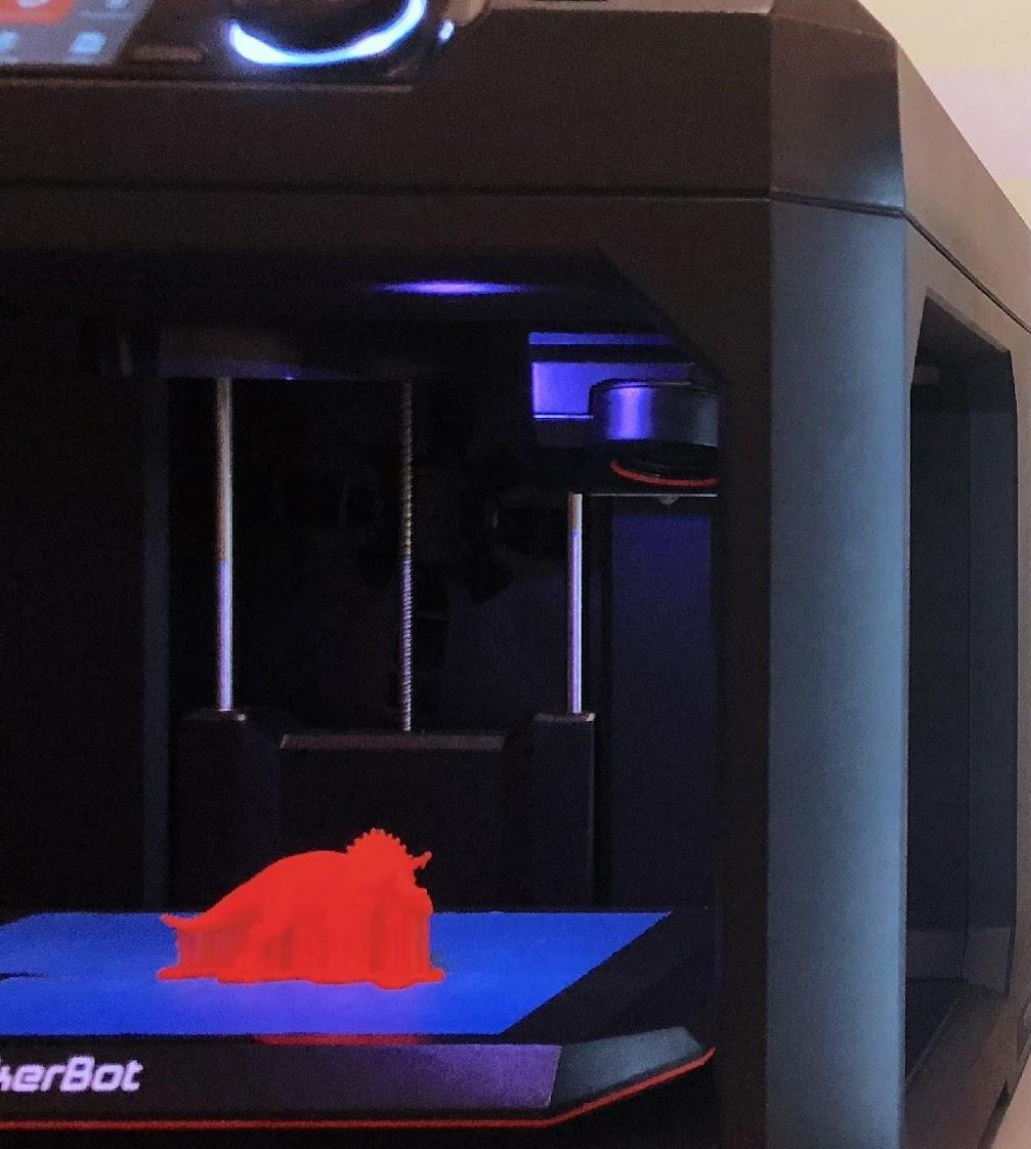
Find and cite one book or article in your field

 1. Where is the book or article and how do I access?
 2. How can I save the book information (book name, author, etc.) for citing?
 3. How do I find more books or articles on the same topic?
