## **University of Victoria Youth in Care Tuition Award**

The UVic Youth in Care Tuition Award and Tuition Waivers are offered to assist students who are former BC Youth in Care, as defined by the Child, Family and Community Service Act. The award covers actual tuition costs and mandatory fees for the terms required for completion of a first undergraduate degree. Eligible applicants may also receive funding to assist with the costs of books, supplies and living expenses.

## Who is eligible?

- Students who have received care in the Province of British Columbia through the Child, Family and Community Service Act for a minimum of 12 months (consecutive or accumulated) in any, or a combination of, the categories as outlined in the consent form.
- Students who were in any of the care statuses outlined in the consent form at the time they turn(ed) 19 regardless of their time in care.
- Students who are offered admission to the University of Victoria for the upcoming term of study and are registered in their first undergraduate degree program.
- Students who register and maintain enrolment in full-time studies, 60% of a full-time course load per term (4.5 units per term, 3.0 units per term for students with a permanent disability) and have attained a sessional grade point average of at least 2.0 in the previous two terms of funded study.
- Students who demonstrate financial need.
- Students who have already received approval for the Provincial Tuition Waiver program.

If applicants are not sure whether they meet any of the above criteria, they should contact their former social worker, any Ministry of Children and Family Development office or any delegated Aboriginal agency for clarification.

Upon student consent, the University will verify each student's eligibility with either the Ministry of Child and Family Development, the Ministry of Social Development and Poverty Reduction's Child in Home of Relative Program or the Ministry of Indigenous child and family development. If approved, you will be contacted by the University of Victoria to confirm your eligibility and details of funding. The University of Victoria reserves the right to change criteria based on funding availability.

Students must be a resident of British Columbia, who is living or has lived as a youth in care in British Columbia under <u>one</u> of the following conditions as defined by the Child, Family and Community Service Act (CFCSA) at the time they turn(ed) 19 or for at least 12 months (consecutive or accumulated in any combination).

- Continuing Custody Order pursuant to sections 41 (1) (d), 42.2 (4) (d), 42.2 (7) or 49 (4), 49 (5) or 49 (10) of the Act;
- o Temporary Custody Order pursuant to sections 41 (1) (b) of the Act;
- Special Needs Agreement pursuant to section 7 of the Act;
- Voluntary Care Agreement pursuant to section 6 of the Act;
- Youth Agreement pursuant to section 6 of the Act;
- o Extended Family Plan pursuant to section 8 of the Act;
- Permanent Transfer of Custody Order with person other than a parent pursuant to section 54.01 or 54.1 of the Act;
- Temporary Transfer of Custody pursuant to section 41(1)(b) of the Act;
- o Interim Custody Order with a Director pursuant to section 35(2)(a);
- Interim Custody Order with person other than a parent pursuant to section 35(2)(a) of the Act;
- Adoption;
- o Under the Guardianship of a Director pursuant to the Infants Act;
- Under the Guardianship of a Director of adoption under the Adoptions Act.
