

Post-Doctoral Fellowship Gerontology Research Centre

The Gerontology Research Centre in the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences at Simon Fraser University located on unceded Coast Salish Territory - the traditional territories of the Squamish, Musqueam, and Tsleil-Waututh peoples, seeks a recent doctoral degree graduate with strong research skills and interest in research and development related to social-behavioural/health aspects of aging. Substantive areas should include one or more of the following: social isolation/loneliness and aging, resilience and aging, environment and aging, and/or social determinants of health. The candidate will be appointed as a post-doctoral fellow, which is a non-tenured faculty position. Duties will include:

- Develop and carry out a program of research consistent with strategic initiatives of the GRC
- Write proposals seeking funding for this research program and other possible topics
- Serve as a resource for university and community groups and individuals with an interest in your areas of research expertise
- Contribute to the GRC in other ways: e.g. assist with the GRC Newsletters, workshops or conferences or serve on committees or task forces that are relevant to your research interests.

Applications are welcome from gerontology, health sciences, and social sciences. The successful candidate will have publications and research interests/experience in the areas noted above.

This can be a one- or two-year position with the possibility of renewal at the renowned Gerontology Research Centre (GRC). Salary is between \$60,000 and \$80,000 (depending on experience) per annum, including a professional development allowance and standard benefits. Based at the Harbour Centre campus in downtown Vancouver, the GRC's mandate is to conduct and foster research on individual and population aging. (www.sfu.ca/grc).
