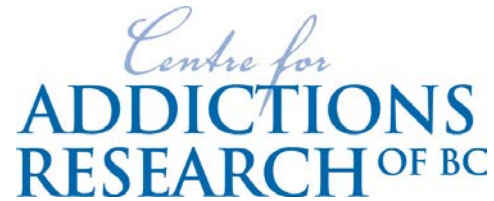

## **Graduate Student Support Opportunities at CARBC 2016-2017**

The Centre for Addictions Research of BC (CARBC) is committed to supporting graduate students affiliated with the centre. For 2016/17, \$24,000.00 has been budgeted for new and continuing CARBC graduate student funding. To be eligible, students must have a supervisor or co-supervisor who is a CARBC Scientist/Site Director and must also be pursuing a focus on substance use or addictions in their graduate research.

**Applications are due by June 30, 2016.**

Two types of graduate student support opportunities are available:

### **A. Graduate Student Fellowships (at least \$2,000.00 each)**

Interested new graduate candidates, with the agreement of a CARBC Scientist/Site Director to be their supervisor or co-supervisor, should submit their resume, a copy of their academic record, a letter explaining financial need and a letter of reference from their (co)-supervisor supporting their application, to Emma Carter at [ecarter@uvic.ca](mailto:ecarter@uvic.ca) with a subject line of "CARBC Graduate Student Fellowship".

Continuing CARBC graduate students interested in applying for these funds, should submit their resume, a copy of their academic record, a letter explaining financial need and a letter of support from their (co)-supervisor reporting on progress through the graduate program, to Emma Carter at [ecarter@uvic.ca](mailto:ecarter@uvic.ca) with a subject line of "CARBC Graduate Student Support".

New and continuing graduate students must not hold major external funding exceeding \$10,000.00 (award/grant/fellowship/scholarship/other non-employment related monies.\*) for 2016-17.

### **B. Support for Graduate Student Travel or Research Activities**

\$2,000.00 total has been budgeted for CARBC graduate students in relation to research (normally up to \$500.00 per student). Eligible activities usually include Conference Travel to present the results of a research study or activities involving data collection in substance use/addictions research. For these funds, students should email Emma Carter at [ecarter@uvic.ca](mailto:ecarter@uvic.ca) with the subject line "Student Travel or Research Activities", outlining the proposed purpose of the funds. There is no deadline for these funds and they will be allocated on an individual basis until all funds are used.

\*Employment income is understood as monies received in payment/exchange for work study, teaching, research, performance of personal services – in the form of either wages or self-employment income. With demonstrated financial need, employment income will not preclude an applicant from being considered for a CARBC student Fellowship.
