

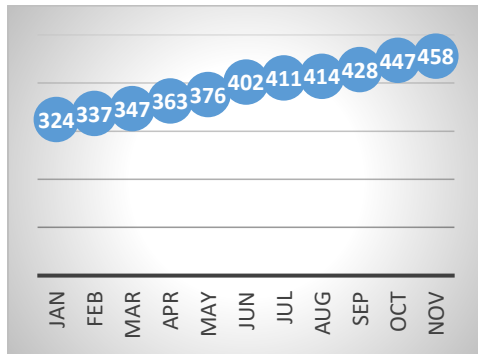
## 2023 Highlights

Figure 2: Jurisdictions of members

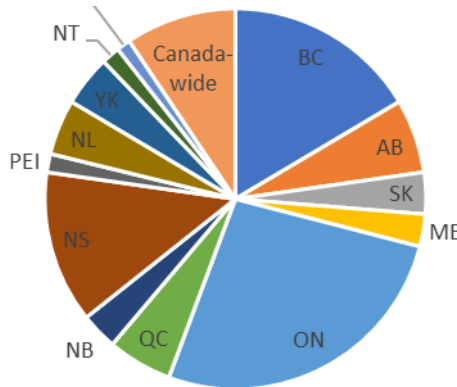


Figure 3: Affiliations of members



### Events and activities

During the 2023 calendar year, the CAPE CoP delivered **10** learning events (webinars and networking sessions) and facilitated **8** meetings of the alcohol warning labels (AWL) working group<sup>1</sup>
