

Many individual examples of best practice policies were found across Canada. If all these had been consistently implemented, the provinces and territories would have collectively scored 87% i.e., improvements are feasible.

The net revenue from alcohol in Canada of **\$10.9 billion** was

only 75% of the estimated

\$14.6 billion costs in 2014. All provinces and territories ran a *deficit*, with alcohol revenues being lower than the economic costs.
