In this talk, I explore how a focus on gaps, tensions, and “negative spaces” (such as silence, materiality, etc.) can enhance our understanding of reconciliation work. I look at examples from the ongoing “Reconciliation and Beyond” ministry of the diocese of BC. I hope to show how an emphasis on negative structures and elements that, at first glance, resist traditional academic analysis can provide new and creative impulses in this process.

Edda Wolff is a post-doctoral fellow at the CSRS. They have worked as an Episcopal priest in Europe (Frankfurt and Paris) and hold a Ph.D. in Liturgical Studies from Durham University.
