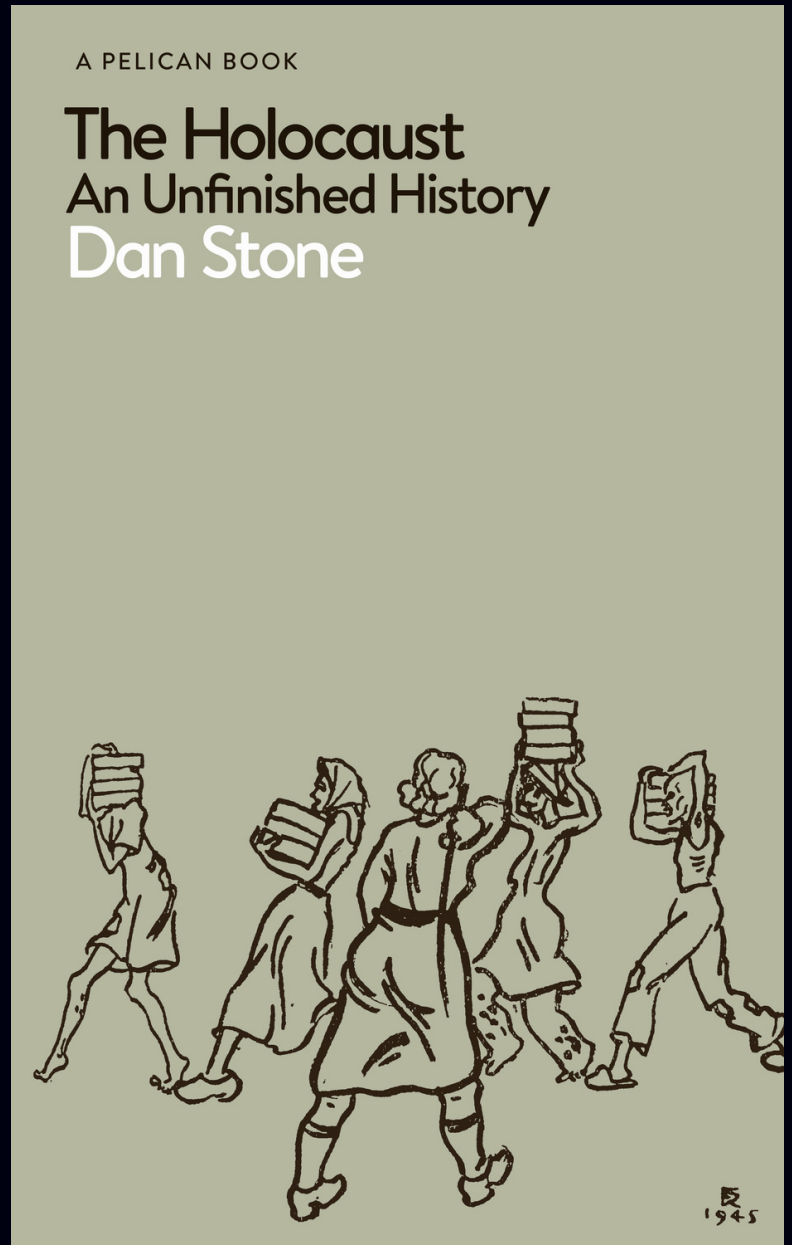

Dan Stone

The Holocaust is much-discussed, much-memorialized and portrayed in fiction. But major parts of its history have still not been understood. Drawing on his new book *The Holocaust: An Unfinished History*, Dan Stone focuses on: the need to understand the significance of Nazism's genocidal ideology; why the Holocaust is not synonymous with the history of the Nazi concentration camps; the shortcomings of the commonly heard concept of "industrial genocide"; and the fact that the genocide of the Jews required continent-wide collaboration.

Dan Stone is Professor of Modern History and Director of the Holocaust Research Institute at Royal Holloway, University of London.
