Purpose: guide and inform learning about the integration of an equity lens in public health and to contribute knowledge of health inequities reduction.



Concept Mapping


To be useful, a health equity tool should...






- Have a clear feedback loop to improve practice

- Assist program planners to improve the equity of their programs
- Lead to the identification of areas for improvement in policy/program










Reflexive Institutional, Cultural and Public Health Lens
