The purpose of this research project is to learn more about the experiences of Trans+ people whose jobs involve atypical employment contracts, limited social benefits and statutory entitlements, job insecurity, low job tenure, low earnings, poor working conditions and/or high risks of ill health.

If you are (a) living in Canada; (b) identify as transgender, non-binary, Two-Spirit or otherwise gender diverse; and (c) currently (or recently) worked under conditions which resemble those listed above, you are eligible to participate.

Interviews will be conducted online via Zoom, take 45-60 minutes, and those who complete an interview will receive \$50 payable by etransfer, prepaid Visa, or a \$50 grocery store gift card.
