PART 3: Dr. Howard, Revised Course outline for last third of course March 9- April 2

Dear Bioc 401 Class,

As I have indicated, in order to slow the spread of COVID19, we will move to on-line deliver effective Monday March 16th. Online courses are an entirely different animal and take a tremendous amount of resources not just from instructors but also in IT support. So I will say upfront, please keep your expectations low and be patient with us- we are trying our best but none of us have experience with this format.

I have pared down the material to make it more reasonable to handle for both of us. Below is the grading scheme and topics, which have been adjusted to redistribute the marks a bit more evenly. Since you will have access to your notes and reading material, the evaluations will be open book style and I will evaluate you on your understanding of the material presented.

Before each class, I will post some combination of slides, and/or reading material on course spaces. Please read before our scheduled class time. During class time, I will have a chat room open where you can post discussion questions. I encourage everyone to participate with both their questions and what they think the answer may be, and I will try to guide the conversation. Hopefully this works. To reduce the burden on the system, our assignments, quizzes and tests will not be timed. You will have 24 hours to complete. A reminder it is an academic offense to plagiarize the work of others. While you may discuss amongst yourselves you must ensure the work you submit is in your own words. In the interest of public health, I strongly urge you not to meet together to work on this. Please practice social distancing during this time.

The quiz on the 23rd will cover only the section on miRNA. The final test will cover only the section on nonsense mediated decay.

In-person office hours are now cancelled. In its place, I will be available in a chat room on course spaces Mondays and Thursdays 3-4pm. As you can imagine it has been a crazy week with meetings and planning. In the event I cannot make on-line office hours as posted, I will create another time.

I may elect to answer you question on course spaces so that all can see it. Or we may have to set up a phone conversation. Email will take longer to respond to.
