SUMMARY OF DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES: The Junior Laboratory Assistant, under the instruction and guidance of the Senior Laboratory Instructors and Scientific Assistants, will assist the set up of the undergraduate student laboratories. Duties include general daily lab maintenance and ensuring equipment and supplies are in place for the teaching labs. The Junior Laboratory Assistant may also assist in maintaining cultures of organisms, creating and/or testing content, and preparing the laboratory spaces for the Fall and Spring term. Duties may require assistance with animal husbandry (including insect care) or plant care. Successful candidate will be available Sept-Dec on Tues - Thursday 7-9am, Friday 8:30am-12:30pm, and Jan-April on Tues 7-9am, Wed 7am-12:30pm, Thur 7-9am and Friday 8:30-10:30am.					
REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE: The successful candidate must have completed third year course work in the Biology program, or have equivalent experience. The candidate must also be organized, detail oriented, and able to accurately follow protocols as well as work independently. Previous laboratory or research experience is an asset. There will be some flexibility in how the part-time hours are worked, but the Junior Lab Assistant should be available at the times stated above.
