Congratulations Dr. Rossi Marx



Congratulations to Dr. Rossi Marx, who has accepted the position of Board Member on the Science Fair Foundation BC.

The post came as a result of Dr. Marx's involvement with the Vancouver Island Regional Science Fair (VIRSF) since 1989, where she served as judge for 15 years, before becoming co-chair in 2004 and chair since 2005.

Every year, VIRSF brings 215 to 230 participants from

grades 4-12 from public and private schools, as well as home-school children, from as far north as Nanaimo. Dr. Marx feels lucky to have had the opportunity to work with a group of very dedicated volunteers, who all strive to make the fairs a success year after year.

Dr. Marx's involvement with the fair and her dedication to the students, teachers and parents have played a role in her being awarded the University of Victoria President's Distinguished Service Award in 2014 and the Youth Science Canada Distinguished Service Award in 2015. Dr. Rossi also became a Paul Harris Fellow by the Rotary Foundation of Rotary International in 2015.



The NSERC Undergraduate Student Research Awards (URSA) are intended to stimulate students' interest in research and to encourage them to consider graduate studies and pursue a career in research. The USRA has a value of \$4500 plus supervisor's contribution (minimum \$1125). Students must complete a 16 week consecutive term. The start dates are May 1, September 1 or January 1. Vancouver Island University, Fisheries and Oceans Canada and the University of Victoria are conducting a collaborative project to investigate microplastics in British Columbia's coastal ecosystem. This project will determine the presence, types and extent of microplastics in shellfish and their surrounding environment and investigate the impacts of microplastics on animal health and function

The student will have the opportunity to work with the shellfish industry, non-profit, government and university researchers in a range of disciplines including ecology, contaminants, genomics and aquaculture. We are looking
