Congratulations Drs. Julia Baum and Diana Varela

The Department of Biology's own Drs. Julia Baum and Diana Varela have been making the UVic headlines.

Three University of Victoria researchers known for their passion and commitment to some of the most significant issues facing the country and the planet have been named to the Royal Society of Canada (RSC) College of New Scholars, Artists and Scientists—and Dr. Julia Baum is one of them. Dr. Baum is a powerful advocate for a number of issues faced by Canadian scientists. In addition to receiving global coverage for her research, she recently led an investigation on deteriorating funding for fundamental research in Canada which was reported on by *Nature* and *Science* magazines.





Dr. Diana Varela is featured in one of the leaders ads for the UVic Edge ad campaign. The leaders ads will run in newspapers, magazines, airports and online. Dr. Varela studies are crucial to the carbon cycle and the foundation of marine food chains in the open ocean, coastal environments and in the Arctic. Her research creates new understanding of the impact of climate change on the health of marine ecosystems and food production.





2018 3M National Student Fellowship for Undergraduate and Graduate Students

The award is open to undergraduate and graduate students who are enrolled full time in a post-secondary Canadian Institution, have completed at least one full semester of study at the time of nomination and have not previously received a 3M student fellowship. The 3M National Student Fellowship honours up to ten students from across Canada each year. They receive a \$5000 award. Registration at the Society for Teaching and Learning in Higher Education (STLHE) conference, as well as accommodation and fund towards travel. While at the conference, they will have the opportunity to develop a cross-Canadian collaborative project with other awards winners with the goal of enhancing teaching and learning at the post secondary level.
