Julia Baum is leading a new NSERC Alliance research program and United Nations Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development endorsed action. This research project will assess the storage capacity of blue carbon ecosystems to mitigate climate change.

"Climate change is the greatest threat to society and our planet. Research bringing together the brightest minds from across disciplines and sectors is needed to help develop solutions that will ensure Canada can meet its greenhouse gas emission goals. Our new partnership project is an exciting example of how this can be done."— Julia Baum

This \$1.59 Million, three-year project will bring together 25 collaborators, 4 universities, and 7 partner organizations.

Training and Engagement Analyst \$60,998.61 - \$69,422.06 annually The Data and Licensing section in the Fish and Wildlife Branch leads development, operation, performance management and continual improvement of a comprehensive suite of licensing and data management infrastructure and services to support provincial wildlife and fish management, analysis and reporting. The unit is also responsible for the administration of the Controlled Alien Species program.

The Training and Engagement Analyst leads provincial level engagement, consultation, communication, and training for the section, including overseeing the work of team members. This role also supports the design, development and implementation of system transformation and related regulatory changes. This role requires excellent communication skills for the development of both written and verbal training and communication material. You have sound judgement, excellent organizational abilities and are results oriented to ensure deadlines are met for multiple projects. This is an excellent opportunity for an enthusiastic self-starter who is comfortable working under limited supervision, thrives in a project environment and is skilled in understanding their diverse audience and creating training and communication mechanisms accordingly.
