

Job Posting for SEOS Sessional Instructor – University of Victoria

The University of Victoria's *School of Earth and Ocean Sciences (SEOS)* is seeking a **Sessional Instructor** to deliver EOS 312 - *Introduction to Chemical Oceanography* in the spring 2022 term.

EOS 312 will be delivered virtually by the Sessional Instructor for 3 hours per week via Zoom for the lecture portion of the course. The instructor will work closely with our Senior Lab Instructor who coordinates and delivers another 4 hours of in-person lab on campus.

The appointment is expected to begin on January 10, 2022, and will continue until the end of the final examination period in April 2022. Pay is based on experience and governed by the Collective Agreement between UVic and CUPE 4163. The appointment is not renewable and is not eligible for tenure.

EOS 312 is required for students enrolled in our Ocean Sciences Minor program and introduces them to the sources, distribution, and transformations of chemical constituents of the ocean, and their relation to biological, chemical, geological, and physical processes. Topics include controls on average concentration of chemicals in the ocean; vertical and horizontal distributions of ocean constituents; air-sea interactions; production, export, and remineralization of organic matter; the ocean carbon cycle; human-induced changes; stable isotopes and trace elements.

Please submit a letter of application, a curriculum vitae, a statement outlining your teaching experience and teaching philosophy, and the names and email addresses of three referees who can attest to your pedagogical qualifications to our Department Secretary at: seos@uvic.ca.
