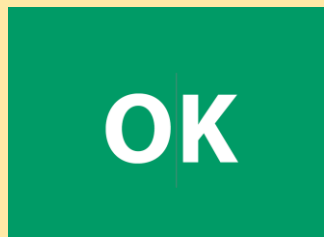

Disaster Comms Tip:
Keep mobile devices fully charged. Add extra chargers & batteries to emergency kits.

Disaster Comms Tip:
Program family & emergency contacts into your mobile phone. As a back-up, include hard copy lists in home, work & vehicle emergency kits.

Disaster Comms Tip:
Draft a family communications plan detailing how you'll connect, e.g. which methods you'll use & in what order.

Disaster Comms Tip:
Forward your home phone to your mobile phone if you're forced to evacuate.
