Position summary

The Student Life Mentor (SLM) role is embedded within the Office of Student Life (OSL), a team that is dedicated to creating supportive spaces, responsive programming and engaging UVic students in matters most important to them. This role is an exciting opportunity for anyone who is interested in engaging UVic students in conversations about campus resources, services, and to act as a guide for navigating the campus community. Student Life Mentors act as vital parts of the Office of Student Life team by acting as peer leaders in fostering relationships and community for all UVic students, mentoring student engagement and growth, and facilitating peer-based support and education initiatives.

The **SLM – Sexualized Violence Prevention** role (**SLM-SVP**) supports the delivery of Sexualized Violence Prevention programming run by the OSL, by providing peer-to-peer education, facilitation, mentorship, and support at our events and programs.

Summary of qualifications

- Current status as a UVic undergraduate or graduate student, available for the full employment term of April 2025 to April 2026
- Lived experience as, and/or experience working with underrepresented students (e.g. 2SLGBTQIA+ students, Indigenous students, BIPOC students, International students, students with disabilities, first generation students etc.) and a variety of students who have diverse worldviews and degrees of familiarity with the campus community.
- Comfort with facilitation and/or presenter experience
- Ability to share information about campus and community resources in a caring, thoughtful, and inclusive ways
- Exercises good judgement and critical thinking
- Strong, accessible communication skills
- Ability to work independently and in a team environment
- Passion for social justice, consent, and building caring communities
- Must have the ability to engage in critical self-reflection and an understanding of the wide variety of different experiences, challenges, and barriers students may encounter at UVic



Role expectations: Sexualized Violence Prevention

- Participate in foundational training in sexualized violence prevention from student and survivor centered, anti-colonial, trauma informed, intersectional feminist, and social justice lenses
- Research and build knowledge of current and emerging trends related to consent, relationships, sexual and gender diversity, anti-oppression, and justice
- Develop student and survivor centered education collaboratively with other students and OSL staff
- Consult with diverse student communities and campus partners on the quality, efficacy, and relevance of educational content
- Facilitate consent and violence prevention programming to the UVic community
- Assess and make recommendations for adapting programming to emerging student needs

Employment term

- June 2025 April 2026
- All SLMs MUST be available Sunday, August 24 for in-person training
- All SLMs must be available to complete approximately 10 hours of self-paced online training during Summer 2025
- 8-12 hours per month (September-April)
- Availability for shifts during work hours (8:30-4:30, Monday-Friday) and some evenings and weekends for events, workshops, and consultations

How to apply

The OSL is recruiting SLMs to participate in four (4) distinct program teams for the 2025-2026 academic year. You may apply to multiple teams but can only be accepted to one continuous program team, as well as Orientation. SLMs may be selected for Orientation on its own, a continuous program on its own, or both Orientation and a continuous program.

Program teams include:

- **Orientation** (short-term)
- Student Leadership (continuous)
- Student Communications (continuous)
- Sexualized Violence Prevention (continuous)
