ANTH HONOURS PROGRAM

- Apply by January 15th in your 3rd year
- Take in the spring term of your 4th year



- Attend an honours seminar (ANTH 499) from January to April
- Work one-on-one with a faculty member on a research project of your choice
- Write a paper & present at a conference

BENEFITS OF HONOURS PROGRAM

- Study anthropology more intensively and independently
- Enhances your research skills asset for professional career and/or grad school
- Spend time in a small group of like-minded students
 - New networking opportunities
 - Supporting and helping each other
- Traditionally considered an excellent preparation for grad school (not a requirement)



TIME COMMITMENT?



To graduate with an Honours degree, students must complete:

- BA or BSc major in Anthropology with extra coursework/credits
 - Extra coursework 5 more courses (7.5 units) in-lieu of electives the total number of courses for graduation does not change)
- ANTH 499 Honours Seminar
 - students learn the theoretical, methodological, and empirical competencies necessary for completion of an honours paper
 - professional development is also a fundamental part of this course
- Honours paper & Presentation
 - Students complete either an in-depth review of literature on a topic of their choice or do original research on an anthropological issue
 - Students present their research at Currents in Anthropology (annual student research conference)



FINDING A SUPERVISOR

- You may consider approaching a potential supervisor in your 3rd year
 - Though most students find a supervisor at the beginning of the honours program
 - Having a clear project outlined and confirmed is not required when you apply

Faculty & staff



- Find faculty with similar research interest and reach out
- Supervisor's agreement to take you on does not guarantee your acceptance into the program

MEETING WITH YOUR SUPERVISOR

The faculty supervisor will guide you and evaluate your work one-on-one over the spring term.

When meeting a potential supervisor:

- Visit faculty member's webpage to learn about their research
- Be informed and enthusiastic; prepare a few questions
- If you already have research ideas, feel free to discuss them
- Please note that some faculty members may not be available if they are on a research leave or already supervising another student

MISCELLANEOUS BITS



- Ethics
 - Under the guidance of your supervisor you will apply for ethics (if applicable)
 - Wise to do early on
- JCURA Jamie Cassels Undergraduate Research Award
 - Supports students' research project under the mentorship of a faculty supervisor
 - Perfect opportunity to do together with honours get paid for your research

- Course load during ANTH 499
 - Depends on each student but anywhere between 3-5 courses

HOW TO APPLY


- Deadline January 15
 - Start time January of the next year
- Apply after you have:
 - Declared an anthropology major
 - Completed ANTH 100, 200, 240, 250 and 260 (minimum combined GPA of 6.5 in all the 200-level courses)

FAQ

When should I apply?

- By January 15th to start in the honours program the next January
- When you are starting your 3rd year and take honours in your 4th year
 - ✓ I.e. if you are in your 3rd year now, apply by January 15th 2025 to take honours in January 2026

How is admission determined?

- Admissions decisions are based on a variety of factors:
 - ✓ Applicant's scholarly promise as evidenced by transcripts/GPA/grades
 - ✓ Availability of faculty to supervise the applicant's research
 - Total number of applicants
- How many students usually apply and how many are accepted?
 - We receive between 10-15 applications
 - We accept between 5-10 applicants per year
