MA or PhD

- Directly in Anthropology
 - ✓ Applications reviewed/final approval made by the ANTH graduate committee
- With concentration in CSPT (Cultural, Social and Political Thought)
 - ✓ Final approval for the concentration made by the CSPT admissions committee
- With freestanding certificate in Indigenous Nationhood (IN)
 - ✓ You apply separately for this
- In interdisciplinary studies (with ANTH as home department)
 - ✓ Applications reviewed/final approval made by the INTD admissions committee.

This research theme connects the traditional subfields of archaeology and biological anthropology to address questions of how humans and non-human primates relate to their environments over both short and longterm time scales.

This research theme works across anthropological and archaeological approaches to see the significance of social spaces, meaningful places and the situated nature of knowledge, through ideas of belonging, cultural landscapes, displacement, borders, land tenure, and built environments—in shaping human life.

This research theme recognizes the significance of understanding the role of social inequality and cultural interpretations in shaping human experience and addressing pressing global issues.

Application process

- Deadline for all applications January 15
 - Online portal opens in September
- Frequently asked application questions available on our website
 - www.uvic.ca/socialsciences/anthropology/graduate/apply/index.php
- Applications are first submitted to Graduate Admissions and Records Office (GARO), reviewed by them and only then forwarded to our department for decision



Choosing a supervisor

- Contacting a supervisor not required, but strongly encouraged
 - ✓ Find out faculty with similar research interest and reach out
 - ✓ Links to faculty profiles:

NOTE: Supervisor's agreement to take you on does not guarantee your acceptance into the program



Funding

- Anthropology department funding (varies)
 - ✓ TA positions (dependent on availability)
 - ✓ Graduate awards and fellowships (based on UVic guidelines e.g. we can recommend students with low GPA)
 - ✓ Individual faculty grants (dependent on faculty)
- UVic awards and fellowships
 - ✓ Emails/opportunities shared with our current grad students
- External funding
 - ✓ Opportunities shared with our current grad students via email
- Emergency funding
 - ✓ Through SAFA (Student Awards and Financial Aid) office

Decisions

We do our best to notify students by the end of March or beginning of April.



Time to completion

- MA 2 years
 - 1st year coursework (min. 5 courses)
 - 2nd year research & thesis



- PhD 4 years
 - 2 year residency coursework (min. 4-5 courses)
 - 3rd 4th year research & dissertation

FAQs

- Can I apply before I complete my previous degree?
 - Yes you just need to complete your previous degree before September
- How is admission determined?
 - Admissions decisions are based on a variety of factors:
 - ✓ the applicant's scholarly promise as evidenced by transcripts.
 - ✓ statement of interest, letters of recommendation and written work
 - ✓ availability of faculty to supervise the applicant's research
 - √ number of students currently enrolled in the program
- How many students usually apply and how many are accepted?
 - We receive between 30-50 applications per year
 - We accept between 10-15 applicants per year
- How many grad students are currently in the program?
 - 44 (23 MA & 21 PhD)



Student's questions from info sessions

- How does a 1-year MA program compare to UVic's program?
 - These programs tend to be be course-based with no research component, so may not prepare you for a PhD
 - They may prepare you for job = good option if you don't wish to go on to do PhD
 - Best to contact the department offering those programs and ask them directly
- What do you think of completing all your degrees at the same university?
 - Understandable especially in today's world (given the high cost of living/moving)
 - Advise against three degrees (undergraduate, MA & PhD) from one school, but two are probably OK
- Can you take a year off between undergraduate and graduate school?
 - Yes –stay in touch with your potential supervisor and/or faculty who you want to write reference letters so they remember you. Also apply for the CGS-M and CGS-D (SSHRC or NSERC funding) in the fall before you start.

Student's questions from info sessions (cont.)



- What if English is not my 1st language
 - English is the language of instruction at UVic. You must demonstrate English language proficiency to attend UVic.

- Can I go from MA directly into PhD before finishing MA?
 - No, we do not allow that in our department (it is mostly US universities that allow that).
- What if I don't have previous degree from ANTH? Can I still apply to ANTH?
 - As per our academic calendar "Applicants will normally be required to have completed a baccalaureate and/or master's degree in Anthropology at recognized academic institutions" however if you have a good reason to be switching from your area of expertise to anthropology make it clear in your letter of statement. You might be asked to take some extra anthropology classes, but we have students who are coming to us from various backgrounds.
- What if I need a visa?
 - If you are an international student apply for visa EARLY as this process can take very long time
 - Our department is not allowed to advise you on this, but we strongly recommend you check out this webpage for international graduate students: www.uvic.ca/graduate/info-for/international-students/index.php
