- [UVic Archaeology field school in Barkley Sound](#) is a six-week field school hosted by the [UVic Department of Anthropology](#) and the [Bamfield Marine Sciences Centre](#) on southwestern Vancouver Island. The field school takes place in the lands and territories of two neighbouring Nuu-chah-nulth Nations, [Tseshah](#)t and [Huu-ay-aht](#).
- The first half of the course is focused on excavation in Tseshah territory in the Broken Group Islands in Pacific Rim National Park Reserve ([ANTH 343](#)). The second half of the course is based out of the Bamfield Marine Science Centre in Huu-ay-aht territory. We are particularly grateful to the Tseshah and Huu-ay-aht for welcoming us and supporting our work.
