

Put on your critical thinking caps and get ready for some intellectual fun in this intensive evening seminar examining cases of apparent ESP, reincarnation, and mystical experience.




LING 181: Introductory Linguistics for Language Revitalization

Remains of more than 700 Indigenous ancestors to be sent home to communities across B.C. thanks to new funding



