

***IMPORTANT: Please ensure that you have read the “How to Use the Program Planning Worksheets” information page.**

Year One:

- **Standing:** You are considered to be a first-year student until you have accumulated 12 units of coursework.
- **Course Selection:** If you have not yet decided which program to pursue, take a selection of courses from different areas; when you choose your program, non-required courses will count as electives. The University strongly recommends that students in Year One **DO NOT** take 300- or 400-level courses, as low grades will impact your graduating GPA.
- **Registration Notes:** ANTH 100 has a lab section so you must register for this as well. Check the course descriptions for the other courses you plan to take this year to make sure you register for any required labs or tutorials.
- **Program Notes:** You can also choose to take a Linguistics course in Year One, which will replace an elective in first year and allow you to take another elective in Year Two.
- **Additional Resources:** Other information for first-year students can be found on the Advising Centre website (web.uvic.ca/advising/). Click on the “First-Year Students” tab to find out about First-Year Check-ins and additional resources.
- **Prerequisites:** Refer to the course descriptions in the Academic Calendar to ensure that you are taking appropriate prerequisites this year for courses you plan to take in Year Two.
 - ANTH 200, 240, 250: minimum second-year standing.

Year Two:

- **Standing:** You are considered to be a second-year student when you have accumulated between 12 and 26.9 units of coursework.
- **Course Selection:** If you have still not decided which program to pursue, continue to take a selection of courses from different areas, but try to narrow it down to two; when you do choose a program, non-required courses will count as electives.
- **Registration Notes:** ANTH 200 has a tutorial section, and 240 and 250 have labs, so you must register for these as well. Check the course descriptions for the other courses you plan to take this year to make sure you register for any required labs or tutorials.
- **Program Notes:** You can also choose to take a Linguistics course in Year One, which will replace an elective in first year and allow you to take another elective in Year Two.

- **Declaring a Program:** Once 12 units of coursework have been completed, most students can officially declare a program. See “How to Use the Program Planning Worksheets” for more information.
- **Additional Resources:** Once you have declared a program, you can visit an Academic Adviser in “CAPPY Hour” in the Learning Commons (Library) to review your CAPP report.
- **Prerequisites:** Refer to the course descriptions in the Academic Calendar to ensure that you are taking appropriate prerequisites for the courses you plan to take in Year Three.

Year Three:

- **Standing:** You are considered to be a third-year student when you have accumulated between 27 and 41.9 units of coursework.
- **Course Selection:** Please ensure that you include 3 units of 400-level Anthropology coursework in Years Three and Four.
- **Declaring a Program:** If you did not declare your program in Year Two and have met any department grade requirements, do it now!
- **Prerequisites:** Please refer to the course descriptions in the Academic Calendar to ensure that you are taking the appropriate prerequisites for the courses you plan to take in Year Four.

Year Four:

- **Standing:** You are considered to be a fourth-year student once you have accumulated 42 units of coursework.
- **Course Selection:** Please ensure that you include 3 units of 400-level Anthropology coursework in Years Three and Four.
- **Applying for Graduation:** In your last year of study, if you finish your courses between September and April, you must submit an application for graduation to Records Services by **December 01** for the following June convocation. If you finish your courses between May and August, you must submit the application for graduation by **July 01** for the following November convocation. If your degree requirements are complete, but you have not yet graduated, you may request a Degree Completion Letter from the Registrar’s Office.
- **Graduation Requirements:** See “How to Use the Program Planning Worksheets” for more information.

Student Responsibility: You are responsible for the completeness and accuracy of your registration and for determining the requirements of your program at UVIC. Attend and submit work only for those courses in which you are registered. Always read course descriptions before you register to determine if you have the necessary prerequisites, and pay attention to notes on mutually-exclusive and cross-listed courses (pairs of courses in which credit will be awarded for only one).
