DUTIES/RESPONSIBILITIES:

TAs must be available on campus during daytime hours to fulfill duties, as needed, for the duration of the term. Duties may include some or all of the following:

- holding scheduled office hours to assist students with problems
- preparing exams and assignments
- grading course assignments and exams
- keeping accurate records of grades
- invigilating mid-terms and final exams
- teaching in-class computer labs or conducting tutorial sessions

SELECTION CRITERIA:

Appointment procedures are based on the guidelines of the CUPE 4163 Agreement, TA Appendix Article 13.02. Selection criteria for all positions will include the qualifications and ability of the candidate(s) based on academic merit and related experience, the career and/or pedagogical value that the experience in a particular position will provide the student, the student's preferences, and other sources of graduate student financial support being received.

All applications will be considered, however, priority will first be given to graduate students registered in the Department of Economics, in accordance with the department's [Appointment Priority Policy](#), including any graduate students with conditional offers of employment included in an offer of admission.

All TAs must have a solid background in the related subject (unless specified otherwise). Excellent command of spoken and written English is essential.
