Brian Thom is an associate professor in the anthropology department at the University of Victoria. As an anthropologist, he is keenly interested in the idea of “place” and the ways people and communities are dynamically and powerfully connected to the places they encounter in their lives. He has worked in Coast Salish communities in BC on Vancouver Island and in the Gulf Islands over the past 25 years, as well as recently collaborative research with an Itelmen indigenous community in Kamchatka (Russia). In 2010, Dr. Thom founded UVic’s Ethnographic Mapping Lab (<http://ethnographicmapping.uvic.ca>), a place for graduate students and faculty researchers to collaborate with Indigenous communities on projects that support Indigenous land rights, resource management, inter-generational knowledge sharing, and public education.
