



**Edward Martin Memorial Field School Award  
GUIDELINES and APPLICATION  
2024 (revised January 2024)**

**Program Objectives**

The Edward Martin Memorial Field School Award has been developed to enhance Indigenous students' access to the *Indigenous Knowledge, Science and Resource Management* (Geography 453: Koeye Field School) course taught by Chris Darimont and Jess Housty. The intent of this fund is to defray some of the costs of this course – typically offered as a field course – for self-identifying Indigenous students. Up to 6 awards covering full course tuition and potentially field course fees and/or travel and visiting student fees (for students beyond Uvic) will be granted.

**Eligibility Requirements**

- Enrollment in GEOG 453 field course (Koeye Field School: Indigenous knowledge, science, and resource management)
- Applicant self-identifies as Indigenous, with preference for applicants from the Heiltsuk or Wuikinuxv Nations, or other central coast nations.

**Evaluation Criteria and Process**

Applications are due with the field school application (February 29, 2024) and will be evaluated by the Course Instructors and Geography Office staff. Students will be notified of the outcome of their application by March 15, 2024. Funds will be applied directly to tuition and – if applicable – field school fees and visiting student fees. If available, travel grants for students traveling from afar will be awarded by cheque.

**Application Submission Dates**

Applications for this fund are to be submitted with the application to the GEOG 453 Field School application by February 29, 2024.

**Application Instructions**

Applicants must complete all sections on the application form below. Please submit your application by the deadline, February 29, 2024, ideally with your field school application, and using one of the following methods:
