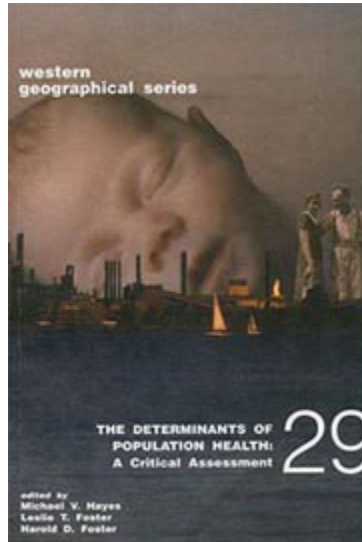


Volume 29 The Determinants of Population Health: A Critical Assessment
