New Student To Do list

Clinical Students:

- 1. Read and follow your clinical manual, with your supervisor's help.
- 2. Complete the Undergraduate Competency Requirements (UCR) form (**clinical students only**) to determine if you need to take any additional courses to complete your UCRs (discuss with supervisor)
 - If you're missing any UCRs, decide with your supervisor how to complete them, preferably in your 1st year but definitely by the end of your second year.

All students (clinical and non-clinical):

- 3. <u>Meet with your supervisor</u>:
 - Find out about office space and get keys (see receptionist in the department office).
 - Plan out your first year of courses.
 - Discuss research projects and your research apprenticeship (PSYC502).
 - Discuss plans for applying for funding for your second year (if applicable).
- 4. Register for courses online <u>http://web.uvic.ca/gradstudies/students/registration.php</u> for all but 502 (complete a "pro forma" a paper form -- with your supervisor to register for 502 for 1.5 or 3.0 units, depending on your program).
 - You need 3.0 units (i.e., 2 courses) per term to maintain "full time" status.
 - You must register in both sessions (winter session: fall & spring terms; & summer session: May to August) to maintain your status as a grad student (if not taking courses or practicum in summer, register for 599/699: thesis/dissertation, or 693: candidacy exams doctoral students only)
- 5. Begin thinking about committee members as your committee needs to be established by the end of the first term or at the latest, by the start of your second year
- 6. Plan on being very busy doing research during the summer (clinical students might also be doing practica) graduate study is a 12 month program; you are expected to be here all year round.
 - Summer may be your best time to get research writing or data collection accomplished.
 - Grad students are allowed 2 weeks vacation each year (*in addition* to University closure days e.g., Christmas/winter break) be sure to consult with your supervisor regarding vacation time.
