COURSE NOTES

It is your responsibility to ensure you are informed about all supplemental information related to courses, as they apply to your program, including prerequisites.

FACULTY & UNIVERSITY REQUIREMENTS

In addition to the listed courses, you must satisfy all [requirements for the Faculty of Humanities](#), as well as complete at least 30 of the minimum 60 required units at UVic. Within these 60 units, 21 units must be upper-level (300/400-level) courses, and 18 of those 21 units must be taken at UVic.

ACADEMIC WRITING REQUIREMENT

If you have not already satisfied UVic's [Academic Writing Requirement \(AWR\)](#), you will need to complete one of ATWP 135, ENGL 146, ENGL 147, or another approved course. Some programs require these courses in addition to the AWR.

Program notes

Course selection

The University strongly recommends that students in Year One **do not** take 300- or 400-level courses, as low grades will impact your graduating GPA.

Prerequisites

Refer to the [course descriptions](#) in the Academic Calendar to ensure that you are taking appropriate prerequisites each year for the courses you plan to take in the following year. Any prerequisites of note are listed under each year below.

Admission

The Child and Youth Care program accepts students in Year One, Year Two and Year Three. Admission requirements for applicants from secondary school are the same as those outlined for the Faculty of Social Sciences. The School of Child and Youth Care offers a number of specialization streams that students may choose as part of their degree. Specialization Streams include: Child Protection, Early Years and Indigenous.

Year One

Program Notes: Students must complete 1.5 units of university level English with a minimum grade of 65% (C+). Students will require one of ATWP 135, English 146 or English 147. Students must ensure they meet the University Academic Writing Requirement (AWR). If the AWR was granted on admission, an additional 1.5 units of English is required but not restricted to ATWP 135, English 146 or English 147.

Student responsibility

You are responsible for the completeness and accuracy of your registration and for determining the requirements of your program at UVic. Attend and submit work only for those courses in which you are registered.

Always read course descriptions before you register to determine if you have the necessary prerequisites, and pay attention to notes on mutually-exclusive and cross-listed courses (pairs of courses in which credit will be awarded for only one).

Year Three

Program Notes: Students transferring from other colleges or universities must have completed a minimum of 12 units of university transfer courses (second year standing) or a human services diploma from an accredited institution with an overall GPA of B (5.0) or higher. Students accepted to UVic with a human services diploma may be eligible to receive 30 units of block transfer credit upon admission to the School of CYC. This does not include vocational or continuing studies.

Requirements may be waived if equivalent courses have been completed prior to admission to the program. All courses required in the program must be completed with a grade of C+ or above.
