

¹A non-nursing elective may be a 100- to 400-level university transferrable course in any discipline other than nursing. A nursing elective may be a 300- or 400-level university transferrable nursing elective but does not replace the 4th year nursing elective required for BSN graduation which must be completed at the University of Victoria. This elective BSN program requirement is waived on admission for students with a previous degree from an accredited post-secondary educational institution.

²400-level nursing course offered at UVic (exceptions will only be made for students accepted into the Emergency Department (ED) program in Victoria or in rural partner sites upon approval of the Director or designate)

If your degree requirements are complete, but you have not yet graduated, you may request a Degree Completion Letter from the Registrar's Office.
