### **David Turpin Building**

An innovative LEED Gold building on campus: designed to go 'beyond LEED' by integrating the unique skills and interests of the building users into its initial design and maintenance. It also features a green roof and was the first structure in Canada to use Pine beetle-



Campus Community Garden

UVic's community-run garden with over ninety plots for staff and students. Its programs are oriented around learning how to support resilient food systems. (Located on Mackenzie Ave, behind the UVic sports fields)



Mystic Vale

A beautiful forested ravine flanked by Western red cedar and Douglas fir. Protected for perpetuity since 1993.
