You may have heard that Naomi Klein has a new book out called "**This Changes Everything.**" Klein argues in her book that a stable climate is impossible within the form of capitalism that currently governs us. SFU prof, Mark Jaccard, recently published a critical <u>review of that book</u>. Jaccard took issue with Klein's provocative critique of capitalism. The economist and professor from the Faculty of Environmental Studies at York University wrote a response to Jaccard, which was pre-published on this <u>website</u>.
