

Lynda Gammon is a University of Victoria, Associate Professor Emeritus. A member of the Visual Arts Department for over thirty years, she taught undergraduate courses, supervised graduate students and exhibited her work nationally and internationally. Her works are in the collections of the Canada Council Art Bank, The Musee d'Art Contemporain de Montreal, The Art Gallery of Greater Victoria, The Legacy Gallery and the Vancouver Art Gallery. She served as Associate Dean of the Faculty of Fine Arts, Chair of the Visual Arts Department, and as a Member of Senate. She also served as a member on many committees across the university such as the initial UVic Strategic Planning Committee as well as the later Planning and Priorities Committee, the Graduate Studies Interdisciplinary Committee, the Internal Research Grant Review Committee, the University Review Committee, the Senate Committee on Agenda and Procedures, the Review Committee for Computing Services, the Senate Committee on Curriculum, the Senate Committee on Committees, the Senate Committee on Admission, Registration and Transfer, and the Ad hoc Committee on Equity Complaint Procedures. She chaired the President's Distinguished Lecture Series Committee and the President's Equal Rights and Opportunities Committee. She has also served on numerous appointment and re-appointment committees including, the Appointment and Review of Associate Vice-President Research, two Vice Presidential Search committees and the Search committee for CRC in the Art History and Visual Studies Department. She has been the recipient of BC Arts Council and Canada Council grants and is a member of the Royal Canadian Academy of Arts and the Gail and Stephen A. Jarislowsky Institute for Studies in Canadian Art. She served as a Board member at Open Space and The Art Gallery of Greater Victoria and currently serves on the board of the Victoria Art Council. In 2023 Gammon was a faculty member in the Summer Banff Artist Residency.
