

## **Geoffrey Loomer – Biography & Statement of Candidacy**

Geoffrey Loomer is an Associate Professor in the UVic Faculty of Law. His teaching and research are focused on international tax, corporate tax, and tax policy. Geoff studied economics (BSc) at UVic and law (LLB) at UBC, after which he clerked with the BC Supreme Court and practised with the tax group at McCarthy Tétrault LLP for five years. He later completed his BCL and DPhil at the University of Oxford, focusing on corporate and international taxation. Geoff was a faculty member at the Schulich School of Law at Dalhousie University in 2009–2018, before joining UVic in 2018. Geoff received the Dalhousie Law Students' Society & Alumni Association Award for Excellence in Teaching in 2013 and the UVic Law Students' Society Terry J Wuester Award for Teaching in 2020, 2021, and 2022. His current research focuses on the technical and political limitations of increasingly harmonized international tax measures, including digital services taxes and global minimum taxes for multinational enterprises.

Geoff was the Associate Dean Graduate Studies at the Schulich School of Law in 2016–2018 and has been the Associate Dean, Administration & Research, at the UVic Faculty of Law from November 2021 through December 2024. He is also serving as a Governor of the Canadian Tax Foundation for 2023 through 2026.
