

Statement of Candidacy

Dr. Lyndze Harvey is a scholar and educator in the Department of Curriculum & Instruction, Faculty of Education at the University of Victoria. She holds a PhD in Education from UVic (2020), along with an MA in Philosophical, Social, and Cultural Foundations in Education and degrees in Education and English/Women's Studies. Her research and teaching focus on political education, pluralistic democracy, critical pedagogy, confronting coloniality in education, and dismantling classroom management systems that undermine relational learning.

Dr. Harvey has served UVic in multiple roles, including Assistant Teaching Professor, Sessional Instructor, and Field Advisor. Across these appointments, she has taught undergraduate and graduate courses, supervised graduate students, and contributed to committees and service work within and beyond the Faculty of Education. Her teaching is grounded in praxis, dialogic engagement, and anti-oppressive commitments that foster deep student reflection and relational accountability.

As a white settler, cis woman, queer, and disabled scholar, Dr. Harvey approaches governance work with an awareness of how power, privilege, marginalization, and access operate within institutional spaces. She understands that universities are shaped by histories and structures that benefit some while constraining others, and she is committed to ongoing reflexivity and accountability in her participation in shared governance.

As a candidate for Senate, Dr. Harvey brings a strong commitment to democratic dialogue, equity, and educational integrity. She seeks to serve as a thoughtful and engaged representative who listens carefully, asks critical questions, and supports decisions that strengthen the university's academic mission and collective well-being.
