

Dr. Sarah Marie Wiebe (she/her) is an Associate Professor, writer, researcher, storyteller, political ecologist and mother who lives on unceded Coast Salish territory and is based in the School of Public Administration, in the Faculty of Social Sciences at the University of Victoria. She has served as the Undergraduate Advisor and Graduate Advisor for the School of Public Administration and led course coordination for the MA graduate program in Community Development. Her research focuses on Climate CARE (Community Actions and Responses to Extreme weather events), democratic engagement, participatory governance and environmental justice. She is a Co-founder of the FERN Collaborative (Feminist Environmental Research Network), author of *Hot Mess: Mothering through a Code Red Climate Emergency* (Fernwood Press) and a Co-editor of *Mothers, Mothering and Climate Change* (Demeter Press).

Dr. Wiebe received the 2025 Canadian Political Science Association (CPSA) Teaching Excellence Award, is a recipient of the 2024 CPSA Smiley Book Prize for her book *Life against States of Emergency: Revitalizing Treaty Relations from Attawapiskat* (UBC Press) and received the Charles Taylor Book Prize for her first book *Everyday Exposure: Indigenous Mobilization and Environmental Justice in Canada's Chemical Valley* (UBC Press). She is currently writing a book about democratic performances and the participatory arts of engagement and has also published on democratic pedagogy and experiential learning. Dr. Wiebe has also provided expert testimony before the Senate of Canada to discuss Bill C-226, an Act respecting the development of a national strategy to assess, prevent and address environmental racism and to advance environmental justice, which passed into law in 2024. She presented to the BC Legislative Assembly Special Committee on Democratic and Electoral Reform, and her contributions appear in the 2025 final report of the Committee "Toward a Stronger Democracy in BC".
