Simon Minshall, MSc (Assistant Teaching Professor; PhD Cand.; MSc Health Informatics, UVic, 2019; BSc Photographic and Electronic Imaging Science, 1996) teaches a variety of challenging topics in Health Informatics to undergraduate students in the UVic School of Health Information Science. As an ATP, Simon is currently focused on teaching: (a) computer programming to nonmajor undergraduate students, (b) the flagship introductory course on Health Informatics, and (c) the undergraduate capstone course.
