

[Dr. Victor V. Ramraj](#) is Professor of Law and Chair in Asia-Pacific Legal Relations at the University of Victoria. Since 2017, he has also served as Director of the Centre for Asia-Pacific Initiatives (CAPI). Before returning to Canada in 2014, he spent sixteen years at the National University of Singapore's Faculty of Law where he served for five years as the Vice-Dean for Academic Affairs, and was twice seconded to the Center for Transnational Legal Studies in London, UK. His recent research interests and publications span comparative public law, transnational regulation, and the state-company relationship. He has published dozens of articles and book chapters in leading publications in North America, Europe, Asia, and South Africa and has seven edited and co-edited collections to his credit, including *Emergency Powers in Asia: Exploring the Limits of Legality* (with A.K. Thiruvengadam, Cambridge, 2010) and *Covid-19 in Asia: Law and Policy Contexts* (Oxford, 2020). His regular courses at UVic are Law and Society in Southeast Asia and States, Companies and Legal Orders in Asia. He also teaches regularly in the LLM in Business Law at Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok.

Since arriving at UVic in 2014, Dr. Ramraj has served on a number of university level committees, including the Advisory Committee for UVic's global strategy; the Research Advisory Committee for UVic's strategic research plan, *Aspiration 2030*; the Senate Committee on Libraries (representing centre directors); the International Strategic Alignment Committee; and the EQHR Policy Advisory Committee. At the Faculty level, he has served as the Director of Graduate Studies and the chair of the Equity and Diversity Committee. In his role as CAPI Director, he is an *ex officio* member of the Research Advisory Committee, chaired by the Vice-President Research and Innovation. He is currently serving on a federal government advisory panel on Canada's Indo-Pacific Strategy.
