# 4. **REMARKS FROM THE CHAIR**

Prof. Cassels noted that this was the last Senate meeting of the academic year. He thanked members of Senate for their work over the course of the year and acknowledged members whose terms were coming to an end.

Prof. Cassels provided a report on the recent announcement from the provincial government regarding a jobs blueprint to re-engineer education and training. He reviewed the contents of the announcement and discussed aspects of it that could apply to the university. Prof. Cassels said the details of the initiative had yet to be released but he expected there would be opportunities for the university to demonstrate that it was responsive and offered relevant programs and opportunities for students. With respect to his personal view, Prof. Cassels said it was his opinion that the province is best served by a diversity of educational offerings.

Dr. Smith asked about government plans to restructure graduation requirements. In response, Prof. Cassels commented on changes being discussed to the K-12 education system. Dr. Riecken added that deans of Education had been meeting with the government regarding building transitions to university.

Dr. Wyatt asked about the component of the initiative focused on students with disabilities. Prof. Cassels said the announcement had focused on transitions and support to students to increase participation rates.

In response to a question from Dr. Hannah, Prof. Cassels said he had not yet heard a response from the student societies. Offering a student perspective, Mr. Bell said he hoped the initiative would be supported by evidence-based decision making.

With respect to matters at the university, Prof. Cassels reported that the Craigdarroch Awards event had taken place the previous evening. Awards were presented to Jim Tully, Peter Dukes, Leslie Saxton and Harald Krebs.

Prof. Cassels reported on the university's results for NSERC and SSHRC funding. He congratulated those who had received funding from the granting councils.

With respect to recent rankings, Prof. Cassels reported on the university's results in the 2014 CWTS Leiden Ranking.

Prof. Cassels also reported that the following awards and honours had been received by members of the university community:

- Prof. Mary Anne Waldron's book "Free to Believe: Rethinking Freedom of Conscience and Religion in Canada" was the recipient of the Canadian Law and Society Association Book Prize for 2013;
- Dr. Andrew Weaver was being awarded an honorary degree from McMaster University;
- Dr. Francis Zwiers was being awarded an honorary degree from Western University;
- Dr. Nancy Turner was being awarded an honorary degree from the University of Northern British Columbia;
- Dr. Bonnie Leadbeater was the recipient of a BC Community Achievement Award;
- Dr. Michael Prince was awarded CUFA-BC's Academic of the Year; and
- Dennis Washington was selected to receive UVic's Gustavson School of Business Distinguished Entrepreneur of the Year Award for 2014.

## 6. PROPOSALS AND REPORTS FROM SENATE COMMITTEES

#### a. Senate Committee on Academic Standards

#### i. Timely Declaration of Majors

Dr. Mateer introduced the proposal. She reviewed the current situation regarding declaration of majors and provided a summary of the challenges with this system. Dr. Mateer outlined some of the benefits associated with the proposal, noting that students would be able to receive better advising and that units would be able to connect with students at a much earlier stage.

Dr. Gillis commented on the specific challenges experienced in the Faculty of Science with the current system, noting that programs tend to be prescriptive. She said this made early connections and advising necessary for success. Dr. Gillis said her colleagues in the faculty were excited by the initiative.

Dr. Webb advised that the Faculty of Social Sciences was overwhelmingly in favour of the proposal, which would provide increased assistance to students. He noted that this one piece of a larger set of initiatives to engage and support students.

Dr. Banerjee commented on discussions in the Faculty of Humanities regarding the proposal. She noted that a slightly different proposal was being presented for her faculty than for the Faculties of

Science and Social Sciences. Dr. Banerjee reviewed the proposal, which was less prescriptive and allowed students a long period of time to declare a major.

Dr. Monahan said he was supportive of the proposal but expressed concern with use of the term "exploratory", which was currently used to describe an admissions category at the university. He wondered if this would create confusion. Dr. Webb commented on discussions regarding use of the this term that took place as the proposal was developed and said he felt use of the term "exploratory" was essential to the proposal. He thought the risk of confusion was minimal, and that if confusion did arise that it made most sense to consider changing the term used to describe the admissions category. He said he would be happy to work with the Office of the Registrar in this regard. Dr. Monahan suggested it would also be useful to engage the Senate Committee on Admission, Re-registration and Transfer. Prof. Cassels said the request to engage the Office of the Registrar and the Senate Committee on Admission, Re-registration and Transfer.

## d. Senate Committee on Awards

## i. New and Revised Awards

Dr. Keller said he was excited to see the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary scholarships; however, due to a real or perceived issue of fairness, he would like to see consideration of the scholarships tabled. Dr. Keller explained that it was unfair to have the same number of awards for all faculties regardless of number of students in the faculty. He noted that it was more difficult for students in large faculties to be eligible for this award. More generally, Dr. Keller commented that the structure of these scholarships added to the already existing difference in funding available to students in different faculties.

Prof. Cassels confirmed that Dr. Keller wished to present a motion to table consideration of the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary scholarships. He clarified that there was generally no discussion allowed regarding motions to table. Prof. Cassels added, however, that the issues of fairness raised by Dr. Keller should be referred to the Vice-President Academic and Provost for consideration.

<u>Motion:</u> (P. Keller/J. Archibald) That consideration of the  $50^{\text{th}}$  anniversary scholarships be tabled to a future meeting of Senate.

#### DEFEATED

Prof. Cassels noted that there was a tie vote on the motion to table. In accordance with the Senate Rules and Procedures, in the case of an equality of votes, the question is resolved in the negative.

Prof. Calder said she appreciated seeing the Youth in Care Award and asked if consideration had been given to waiving tuition for all youth in care. Dr. Tremblay responded that the university was putting forward an initiative to support youth in care. Mr. Dunsdon added that development of the scholarship on a pilot basis was a first step in the initiative. Although it was not possible to provide a tuition waiver to all youth in care at this time, Mr. Dunsdon was positive about the possibility of fundraising to support ongoing scholarships.

With respect to the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary scholarships, Ms. Natalie Fallis from Student Awards and Financial Aid noted that the scholarships were the result of fundraising efforts by the faculties.

Dr. Smith said he supported the creation of additional 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary scholarships, but did not think these should take away from the scholarships offered in other faculties.
